- Advise Welsh Government about future developments in healthcare.
- Monitor and advise on prescribing patterns
 - National Prescribing Indicators




Vision: To get the best outcomes from medicines to improve health and well-being of all people in Wales



Optimise the **value** that NHS Wales achieves from its investments in medicines







All Wales Therapeutics and Toxicology Centre (AWTTC)

- AWTTC acts as the secretariat for the AWMSG and supports AWMSG and its subgroups
- AWTTC is an NHS organisation tasked by Welsh Government to deliver a range of services against an agreed work plan
- Our aim is to improve the health and well-being of people in Wales by enabling patients to get the best outcomes from their medicines, and to be better informed.
- AWTTC is split into four main work programmes which seamlessly interact and overlap:
 - Patient Access to Medicines
 - Medicines Optimisation and Data
 - Yellow Card Centre (safety)
 - Welsh National Poisons Unit

- Strategic Partnerships and input at key national and international meetings
- Responsive to meet the needs of the NHS in Wales
