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Introduction

The NHS Wales Decarbonisation Strategic Delivery Plan, published in March 2021, sets out the ways in which we will address the climate emergency. The Plan has 46 initiatives and targets for the decarbonisation of NHS Wales. The targets are ambitious and may require a drastic change in our approach to healthcare, but we must act immediately if we are to reduce our impact on the climate. The NHS Wales decarbonisation targets are to reduce carbon emissions by 16% by 2025, and by 34% by 2030.

The Well-being of Future Generations (Wales) Act (2015) places a duty on the NHS in Wales to consider sustainability throughout its work. Therefore, it provides a purposeful driver for NHS Wales to make real changes in the carbon emissions associated with its services. Public bodies in Wales must work towards achieving all of the act's 7 wellbeing goals to make a prosperous, resilient, healthier, more equal, and globally responsible Wales, of cohesive communities, vibrant culture and thriving Welsh language.

The All Wales Therapeutics and Toxicology Centre (AWTTC) and the All Wales Medicines Strategy Group (AWMSG) support NHS Wales to implement the initiatives and ensure the targets are achieved. AWTTC is hosted by Cardiff & Vale University Health Board and is involved in sustainability strategies and groups at a local level. On a national level AWTTC contributes to the sustainability initiatives of NHS Wales, including the national strategy for Wales on 'Decarbonisation – inhaler prescribing use and disposal'. AWTTC plays a key role in liaising with representatives of the pharmaceutical industry in Wales about their sustainability initiatives.

This document sets out AWTTC's plan of local and national actions to help us reduce the NHS carbon footprint, work more sustainably and make Wales a better place to live for current and future generations.

What will we do?

AWTTC will engage and support its staff to make sure that our staff and visitors know about AWTTC's commitment to sustainability, and that staff feel valued in their contribution.

AWTTC will promote environmental monitoring as part of project management. We will build staff capacity to help support the "green" agenda, locally in the Cardiff & Vale University Health Board (C&V UHB) and nationally in Wales.

AWTTC will support sustainability by:

- Considering the environmental impacts arising from our activities and setting objectives and targets for activities having the most significant impact.
- Considering all relevant environmental legislation, and other environmental requirements or commitments.
- Engaging with colleagues, stakeholders, patients and the public to ensure that our work is relevant and sustainable for NHS Wales.
- Reviewing our policies to take account of changes in Welsh Government targets as well as internal and external factors.
- Considering the environmental impact of projects undertaken by AWTTC, to
 ensure the environmental effect is reduced as much as possible in agreement
 with interested parties and periodically monitoring and measuring their outcome.
 As part of sustainable quality improvement, the value of healthcare outcomes will
 be considered against the triple bottom line of environmental, social and financial
 impact.

Our focus will be to:

- Enable AWTTC staff to follow the "green" agenda at work and:
 - reduce our use of materials and energy;
 - use recycling initiatives:
 - o reduce medicines waste; and
 - reduce the environmental impact of our business travel by using environmentally friendly transport, and alternative mechanisms to deliver our work effectively.
- Explore how to measure the impact of AWTTC's sustainability actions on the environment.

- Explore how we can evaluate the environmental impact of new medicines in AWMSG's health technology assessment process.
- Embed sustainability in our medicines optimisation process by supporting initiatives to:
 - o reduce pollution;
 - o recycle medicines;
 - o reduce medicines waste;
 - o promote best practice for medical conditions caused by pollution; and
 - support social prescribing initiatives.
- Use data to monitor the use of medicines with a high carbon footprint in Wales and report on the progress of initiatives to improve sustainability.
- Engage and support staff to promote environmental monitoring as part of project management and build staff capacity to help deliver a "green" medicine agenda in Wales.
- Use an equality and health inequality impact assessment (EqHIA) to try to make sure all members of society in Wales are informed, involved and benefit from the outcomes of our projects, medicines optimisation work and medicines appraisals, and policies.
