To reduce the carbon impact of inhalers in Wales, AWTTC will work with Welsh Government, NHS Wales, and other organisations in Wales, to: collaborate with a range of stakeholders including patients and the public, policy makers, the pharmaceutical industry and healthcare professionals; take a holistic patient-centred approach to 'greener' respiratory care from diagnosis through to inhaler disposal; design interventions and test pilot services based on best evidence or information available and informed by behavioural insights and data; ensure appropriate data on inhaler prescribing in Wales is accessible to all stakeholders to inform activity and monitor progress against the decarbonisation initiatives in the NHS Wales Decarbonisation strategic delivery plan. provide guidance and educational resources to encourage carbon literacy.

For example:	In the month of November 2022, a total of 357,024 respiratory inhaler items with an indicative carbon footprint of 4,784 tonnes of CO2e (tCO2e) were prescribed in primary care in Wales. 66% of inhalers prescribed were metered dose inhalers – which have a high global warming impact.
